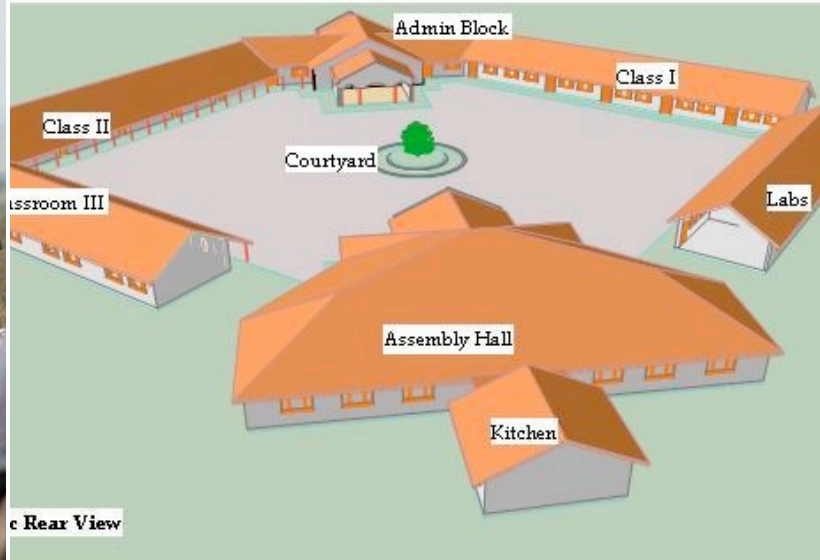

The Partnership

Every year 270 children complete primary education in the area. 50 students can afford to go to a secondary schools many miles away. The rest, some 220 children have nowhere to go.
